

STEPPING INTO THE LIGHT OF HUMILITY

Proverbs 22:6 tells us that we are to "train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old, he will not depart from it." This verse well represents what Girls' Haven is all about and what our staff does on a-daily-basis. We are responsible for ensuring that our kids are enrolled

in school, taken to medical appointments, properly fed and to remind them they are an intrinsic value no matter where they have come from. We are responsible for developing meaningful relationships with them on any occasion that presents itself. Sometimes it is in the day of small things such as teaching bicycle lessons for the first time. Imagine, growing up as a child and not having the opportunity to enjoy such a simple activity. On a cold freezing and rainy afternoon, our Treatment Director discovered that 14-year-old *Rebecca didn't know how to ride the bicycle that was generously donated to her this past Christmas. Mr. Alan, who has a habit of demonstrating humility at the highest level decided to put his usual duties aside and began the instructions.

As usual, such a new event was challenging for Rebecca; however, she put her feet on the peddles and gripped the handlebars while Mr.

Alan repeatedly guided her on the campus parking lot...successfully!

As we continue developing relationships and teaching skills to our kids, we know from the words of Winston Churchhill, "success is not final, failure is not not fatal: it is the courage to continue that counts." Our kids are courageous, and they

should be congratulated...daily! Rebecca has led us into exploration – to see what is behind her struggles, to discover what works and what doesn't. She is a prime example of how we must mold our program to fit each child's needs rather than the other way around. The fight for Rebecca has kept us conditioned and ready for battle for our other kids. We have grappled with the desire to give in – the perception that the battle is *too* long and *too* hard. We must be determined to be "in it" for the long haul, willing to advocate for Rebecca, and all of our kids, to the end. We have realized that we must keep in mind who she is, who she is becoming and who the battle belongs to, or the fight becomes overwhelming.



Mr. Alan Apperson is the Treatment Director and a licensed professional counselor at Girls' Haven. He is responsible for overseeing all treatment services provided to our residents. He is experienced in treating "at-risk" children with mental health disorders as well as anxiety, depression, and anger. He is a veteran counselor with over 15 years of experience. He is very instrumental in the operations at Girls' Haven. Alan holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology from Texas A & M University and a M. Ed from



ADULTING WITH A SAFETY NET

Vears ago, nationwide, a foster child upon graduating from high school was abruptly dropped into adulthood. With no family support, frequently no place to live and few marketable job skills, the result was often understandably tragic. Girls' Haven began the Supervised Independent Living program in 2017, taking an initial step into combating this problem. The SIL program trains our residents for adulthood and allows them to take gradual steps towards independence within close boundaries. Behind the scenes, we have been researching and planning. Rather than extend the time which our residents are dependent and under tight boundaries, we want to prepare kids for the future by offering independence with support and the opportunity to fail so they can learn and grow with a safety net.

Meet Clarissa (19) & Skylar (18) who are roommates in the SIL program. Each come with their own unique journey of being in foster care; however, together they are learning that their past doesn't have to be their future. Clarissa arrived at Girls' Haven in 2014 and progressed through our basic care program until she was old enough to transfer to the SIL program. She currently has a job at Goodwill and has a goal to become a Veterinarian. She is happy she chose to do this because she realizes she will be able to grow into who she is because of this opportunity. She feels honored that GH put her in the SIL program. She went from a year ago not thinking she'd graduate high school to living on her own, but with people around to help her if she needs them.



Skylar has been in the Girls' Haven program since May of 2017. In August of 2018, she was afforded the SIL program opportunity. She is employed at Sally's Beauty Supply and recently applied at Lamar University and Texas State University and wants to major in Construction Management. She plans to take advantage of this opportunity she's been given to have a positive effect on the younger kids.

For these young ladies, this is a big step into adulthood. It's getting to grow into adulthood rather than being shoved into it. Most foster kids don't know what to do after graduating from high school - they're just thrust into full-on-adulthood, but Girls' Haven is allowing these young ladies to grow up at a more normal rate. It's adulting with a safety net. Girls' Haven is saying "We care about you, and we're not going to let you fall on your face...and if you do, we're going to pick you up and help you figure out what you need to do and what we need to do to help you succeed."







When they were children, they talked like children, they thought like children, they reasoned like children. Now that they have become **women**, they are learning to put their ways of **childhood** behind them.

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Bethany is a Case Manager of Residential Services and part of our treatment team at Girls' Haven. She is responsible for ensuring that our residents' medical, educational, behavioral, emotional and legal needs are met. She is passionate about the work that she does with the residents and is a positive influence for them. She is a graduate from Lamar University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Family Studies and Minor in Social Work. In addition, she is currently pursuing a Masters degree in Family Studies.

Q: How did you develop such a passion for working with children?

a: I had always wanted to work with children but was unsure in what setting. During my last semester of undergrad, I spoke with an administrator with Girls' Haven and instantly wanted to be part of the mission. Within a short amount of time during my internship with Girls' Haven, I knew it was a place I would always want to be involved with. It is humbling to have the privilege of being a small stepping stone in a child's journey through life.

Q: Every child that comes to Girls' Haven needs to be healed. How do we accomplish this with our kids?

a: We help to heal our girls by offering them a healthy home-like setting with positive encouragement daily. Many of our girls come from very dysfunctional households that lack love and guidance. Our top priority is to nurture girls and let them heal from the inside out. It is truly beautiful to see the girls overcome their trauma and step-by-step begin living a healthy life just as every child should.

Q: What are some of the life-changing experiences that we bring to our kids that live here?

a: We often take for granted the small luxuries we do for ourselves or for our own children. While here at Girls' Haven, going to Schlitterbahn Water Park, the zoo, or simply getting the girl's nails done can be a first-time experience for many of them. Seeing a young girl attend her first birthday party or friend's sleepover is truly heartwarming. It is touching to see the excitement in our girls when such a small activity can bring so much joy.

Q: Why is it important that we establish and maintain positive relationships with our kids at Girls' Haven?

a: Some of our girls have never developed healthy relationships due to their past trauma. They are often stand-offish, not trusting of others, and afraid to make attachments. By providing positive relationships, we help them learn to have trust in people. It is our goal to have a bond with each of our girls and ensure they know they are special by building them up each and every day.



One of our (greatest) **JOYS** is **REDEEMING CHILDHOOD**. So many who come to us have never experienced the innocence, freedom and joy that should be present in the early years of life. Instead, they have known pain, turmoil and adult responsibility. We seek to be the vessel through which **RESTORATION** is pour out.
